Cancellation & Refund Procedures

The Township suffers a financial loss when seniors do not pay for activities. In addition, when a person fails to show up for an activity, someone on a wait list misses an opportunity to take part in a desired program. This has been an ongoing problem; we can no longer afford this inefficiency. As a result, we are now forced to strictly adhere to our procedure for receipt of donations.

As has been the procedure, persons who have registered, but not paid 10 days prior to the program, will receive a phone call reminding them of their program registration and payment due date. From the time a message is left or a call received, a senior has 5 days to mail or bring in the donation. A check can be sent for Bingo only in this case. If the donation has not been received

within the 5 day timeframe, the participant's name will now be removed from the registration list.

Refunds will not be issued unless the space can be filled by a person on the wait list. If the program has no wait list, there will be no refund. The only exception to our refund procedure would be in the event of a hospitalization. Senior Services has adopted a sliding scale method for programs held in the Senior Center to address participants who are experiencing financial hardship. This sliding scale does not apply to Bingo or events outside the Senior Center. In addition, the Program Manager can submit to the Senior Committee a request to subsidize the cost of an off-site party for individuals due to hardship.

Tax Aide is back!

Reservations will be taken beginning January 9, 2012

Tax Aide is a free tax preparation service staffed by IRS trained volunteers who are available by appointment each Tuesday and Thursday, at 9:30, 10:30, 11:30 A.M. or 12:30 P.M., from February 2 to April 10. AARP Tax-Aide volunteers are not professional tax preparers. Hanover Township allows AARP Tax-Aide volunteers to use Township facilities to assist Township residents age 55 and older to obtain free tax assistance. The Township has no control over the manner in which the AARP volunteers prepare the tax returns, nor does the Township review any tax returns to verify whether they have been properly prepared and/or contain any errors. Participants in this program will be asked to sign a Tax-Aide Waiver and Release recognizing certain risks of errors, omissions, and other mistakes in performing Tax Assistance and relinquishing all claims against Hanover Township.

All returns will be filed electronically and printouts will be given to each participant for their records. Circuit Breaker volunteers are also available during these times; please make both appointments by calling 630-483-5600.

Circuit Breaker / Illinois Cares Rx

It is a New Year... which means that it is time to file for your 2013 Circuit Breaker/Illinois Cares Rx benefits! The Circuit Breaker / Illinois Cares Rx program provides the following benefits:

- \$75 License Plate Sticker Discount (Circuit Breaker)
- One-time grant check calculated by the State (Circuit Breaker)
- Prescription assistance in which the State pays the Medicare Part D premium and co-payments are \$5 for generics, \$15 for brand name drugs and \$20 for specialist drugs (Illinois Cares Rx Program). The State did eliminate the \$25 monthly rebate checks for individuals enrolled in a non-coordinating prescription drug plan. ****Please note that prescription assistance is only provided to those enrolled in a coordinating Medicare Prescription Drug Plan****

Income Guidelines for the Circuit Breaker / Illinois Cares Rx Program

Circuit Breaker Program: \$27,610/year for an individual & \$36,635/year for a couple

Illinois Cares Rx Program: \$21,780/year for an individual & \$29,420/year for a couple

Although the filing deadline for the Circuit Breaker / Illinois Cares Rx application is December 31st of every year, we highly encourage you to file for your Circuit Breaker after your income tax is filed (if you are required to file) to ensure that your application is processed and your benefits will continue through next year. You may also contact your Social Services Caseworker with any additional questions or to schedule an appointment.

2012 Medicare Part B Premiums & Deductibles

Great news! In 2012 there will be a 3.6% Social Security Cost of Living (COLA) increase for Medicare Beneficiaries. CMS recently announced that the 2012 standard Part B premiums are DECREASING from the 2011 amounts for most people new to Medicare in the past two years. For most Medicare consumers with annual individual income at or less than \$85,000, the 2012 Part B **premium** will be \$99.90. The annual Part B **deductible** will also be reduced in 2012 by \$22, down to \$140 from \$162 in 2012.

Dial-A-Bus Cancellation Procedure

Effective January 2012

Dial-A-Bus transportation has been experiencing an average of 10% cancellations per day for more than a year. In order to continue to serve the growing number of seniors in our community in the most efficient way, decreasing the misuse of our resources, this cancellation procedure will take effect January 2012.

It is the responsibility of the rider to call, at latest, within 24 hours if it is necessary to cancel a scheduled ride. If the rider is aware of the need to cancel earlier, immediate notification of the cancellation is appreciated. This will give other riders the opportunity to schedule a ride in the openings created in the schedule. It will also eliminate the wasted resources when buses and drivers appear at clients' homes only to discover that the rider is not using the service. We will be

tracking all clients who fail to call to cancel rides. Reminder calls will continue to be made daily.

There are times when the unexpected happens and a ride needs to be cancelled on the same day. We understand that illness or emergencies do occur and last minute cancellations are acceptable for those reasons. However, if a client has a chronic record of allowing buses to arrive at their home and then failing to appear or chronically cancels within 24 hours the following actions will be taken:

After four or more "no shows" within one month, a client will be sent a letter from the Township notifying them of their noncompliance, including a copy of this procedure. Ongoing occurrences may result in suspension of the Hanover Township Dial-A-Bus service
