Sexual Assault Awareness Month - April, 2010

Whereas sexual violence is a devastating and intolerable crime, affecting men, women, and children of all races, ages, cultures, economic situations, and abilities; and

Whereas sexual violence is a major social problem in homes, schools, and communities resulting in countless physical, mental, and other health consequences; and

Whereas sexual violence seriously affects our youth, with one out of every three girls and one out of every six boys being sexually abused before the age of 15; and rape remains the most underreported crime in the United States; and

Whereas the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority reported over 103,000 cases of sexual assault; and

Whereas 86 residents of Hanover Township received 925 hours of services related to sexual assault in FY2010; and 7,016 Hanover Township youth participated in 57 sexual assault prevention/education programs in FY2010; and

Whereas the Hanover Township Mental Health Board promotes services for survivors of sexual violence through funding of the Community Crisis Center, Northwest Center Against Sexual Assault and the Children's Advocacy Center of North and Northwest Cook County; and is committed to preventing sexual violence through education and community action and promoting equality, safety, and respect among all individuals;

Child Abuse Prevention Month - April 2010

Whereas the National Day of Hope on April 2 serves to enhance public awareness on the problem of child abuse and neglect; and

Whereas approximately three million reports of suspected or known child abuse and neglect reports are made to child protective services each year; and

Whereas the actual incidence of abuse and neglect is estimated to be three times greater than the number of reported to authorities and more than four children die each day as a result of abuse in the home; and

Whereas 588,000 American children are unable to live safely with their families and are placed in foster homes and institutions; and

Whereas the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services received reports of over 110,000 cases of abuse and neglect in 2009; and

Whereas the Youth and Family Service department of Hanover Township exists in part to provide outreach services to youth in our communities to create positive familial environments; and

Whereas the Hanover Township Mental Health Board promotes services for survivors of abuse through funding of support agencies, and is committed to preventing abuse through education and community action and promoting equality, safety, and respect among all individuals;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that we, the Hanover Township Board of the Township of Hanover, County of Cook in the state of Illinois do hereby proclaim April 2010, Child Abuse Prevention Month in Hanover Township, and urge all citizens and communities to participate fully in activities and events to observe Child Abuse Prevention Month.




