The Clerk's Office is continuously striving to provide fast, courteous and efficient services to the Township residents, Board, other departments, and other citizens through the most modern and cost-effective methods available, and to maintain the Township records in a systematic, orderly, logically organized, and accessible manner.

Office of the Clerk Update:

- ❖ Mini-Passport Fair was held last Saturday.
- ❖ Our office is currently working with the Department of Cook County Vital Records to have our facility be able to provide certificates of Vital Records such as the Birth Certificates, Marriage License Certificates, Death Certificates, and other vital records convenient to our Township residents. Our proposal is currently under review.
- ❖ This fall, the Clerk's office will be visiting travel agencies, churches, and high school foreign language department to provide them information about Passport Services at Hanover Township.
- ❖ Gubernatorial General Election-November 2, 2010:
 - Processed 90 voter registrations prior to October 5, last day to register to vote.
 - Process several requests for Absentee Ballots.
 - Assisted many with questions in regard to early voting, grace period of registration and voting, and precinct information.

October Board Report

Thank you to all that wore pink for the **REAL MEN WEAR PINK** event on October 13th. The Township has participated the last several years in this national initiative to raise awareness on the importance of screenings for breast cancer. We have distributed 100 packets in English and 20 in Spanish this year, as well as have information tables available in each of the buildings.

Our third PSA (Prostate Surface Antigen) clinic will be held on November 3rd! This fall's clinic is being sponsored by Northwest Suburban Urology. With this generous sponsorship, we are able to screen 50 men at this clinic for FREE! The clinic is by appointment only, and currently we only have 16 spots left available. We are targeting the uninsured, under insured, and high risk population for this clinic. Please contact our office at 630-483-5665 if you or anyone you know needs this screening.

Flu season is upon us! Our first clinic was on September 15th, we hosted Walgreens from Hanover Park. They have done our large public clinic the last few years. We also hosted a clinic on October 7th with CVS of Bartlett. At the EXPO both of these providers offered flu vaccinations as well. We have our regular scheduled kid's clinic on October 14th with Kid Care Medical for the 6 months-18 year olds. The OCH is taking care of the employee flu vaccines; this is free for Hanover Township employees and officials. Please contact our office and we can get you scheduled. I am also able to administer the shot prior to this week's board meeting, just let me know. Our goal is flu prevention! Call us at 630.483.5665.

We have developed and started to distribute a questionnaire on colon health. Once we identify 10-12 high risk individuals that meet the income guidelines set by Dr. Muska and SAMC, we will schedule the colonoscopy screening date. I am very excited to move forward with this life saving screening and thrilled to be working with Dr. Muska and his team.

We are about to start our Eastside Rec Center screenings up again. These monthly screenings have been put on hold for the summer while their client volume is lower. We are working with Tom Kuttentberg for marketing for this event as well as our other clinics and services.

I participated in the Bartlett Fire Department Open House this month as well. It was a chilly day full of networking. I enjoy being out in the community and answer questions regarding Hanover Township and our great services.

We are exploring a potential grant opportunity with Communities Putting Prevention to Work. This is a partnership project led by the Cook County Department of Public Health and the Public Health Institute of Metropolitan Chicago. The goal of this funding is to increase the accessibility of healthy foods, make unhealthy foods less available and create safe places to be physically active. I have asked other directors for their input on potential ideas for this, we have met once already with another meeting scheduled the day after Tom Kuttentberg and I attend an informational workshop for the grant. Successful applicants will be awarded a one-time amount between \$25,000 and \$200,000 to implement their projects from February 2011 to February

2012. I will keep you posted as things progress. Information on projects and exclusions are limited at this time; the RFP will be released early November and the proposal is December 10th.

We have had a large number of students and staff from district U-46 come in for their TB skin testing this past month. This is a requirement to work in the district as well as for clinical for the students in the health occupation classes.

We have had our part time nurse Graciella Bredehoeft recently resign. Ms. Bredehoeft took a full time position with CDH hospital. We are sad to see her leave, but happy for her recent change. We are beginning the process to hire a part time Spanish speaking nurse.

Our monthly meetings/screenings continue to keep us busy as well as many office visits for questions, concerns/resources and other various needs. Our phones continue to ring and we are thrilled at the response we have received regarding our expo from both a vendor standpoint and a participant.

Thanks for the opportunity to serve our residents, as always it is a pleasure and joy to be part of the Hanover Township team!

Facilities and Maintenance

Reporting to – Town Board---October 19th 2010

After completing the repairs to the senior bus garage, the Maintenance department set their sights on the Highway garage. After inspecting the outside of the building, it was determined that we needed roof repairs along with significant siding repairs. We are currently in the middle of completing those repairs. After painting the senior bus garage, we decided to also paint the old outside wing of the YFS department.

With fall temperatures looming around us, we have begun preventative maintenance of the Township HVAC units. There are five units on the Township Administrative building, three at the Mental Health building, as well as two at Astor Ave. We have changed all the filters and belts, also inspecting and servicing all ten units.

On a few bad weather days we pulled the Maintenance staff inside and installed all new ceiling tiles in the Township Assessor's office.

Maintenance is continuing to work with Katie Starkey on the outstanding grants, as well as working with the architects and Cook County to move towards putting detailed plans together.

Lastly, we awarded the contract to Brandeis Architects, LTD., for the design and bid process for the Mental Health building. We are expecting to go out for bid 1st of the year and start construction late February - early March 2011.

Report from the Hanover Township Mental Health Board
10/14/2010

- 1) The Hanover Township Mental Health Board, along with a number of community partners, is sponsoring a mental health conference for area faith community leaders on 11/09/2010. To date, there are 118 persons registered to attend. The conference will be held at 2nd Baptist Church in Elgin 9 am – 4 PM.
- 2) The Hanover Township Mental Health Board, along with a number of community partners, is sponsoring the 3rd Annual Life Changes.Disabilities Expo on Saturday, 12/04/2010 at Poplar Creek Library in Streamwood. Our theme is “Celebrating Caregivers”. The expo is featuring a resource fair, keynote speakers, entertainment provided by Clarewoods Academy/Bartlett Learning Center. U-46 is providing children’s activities. There will be a service dog demonstration. Area organizations are providing self-care activities for the “care takers”. The event is open to the public.
- 3) Grant hearing workshop was held on Monday, October 18th. Members of the Hanover Township Mental Health Board heard 14 presentations, 11 of which related to new programming for area residents.
- 4) The Hanover Township Mental Health Board approved 1 challenge grant to Shelter, Inc to bring Healthy Families Program to Hanover Township residents. In addition, the Hanover Township Mental Health Board approved a capital grant request for website update for the Ecker Center for Mental Health and a capital grant request for laptop for Kenneth Young Center staff working with Hanover Township youth.
- 5) The ED presented on the mental health board’s work with U-46 in developing school based children’s mental health services for area students. The presentation was part of a panel discussing on children’s mental health services coordinated through 708 boards across the state. The panel appearing during a Northwest Illinois Youth Symposium held on October 13 at McHenry County Community College.
- 6) The ED received the Centro de Informacion Humanitarian of the Year award during the agency’s October 2, 2010 annual event.

Programming Highlights

- Lunch Bunch: White Eagle Restaurant, Niles. 53 seniors enjoyed one of our most requested luncheon destinations to White Eagle.
- The Senior Committee donated the fried chicken from Popeye's and both Veteran's Hall and the Activity Room seated 166 people. Staff and volunteers ran carnival style games with prizes outdoors under a tent.
- Arlington Park Racetrack round- trip motor coach transportation, reserved box seating.
- Apple Picking at Royal Oaks Farm, Harvard. 32 seniors had the opportunity to shop and pick apples and take the wagon tour of the farm.
- Millie's Restaurant and American Bandstand Show. Demand for this trip caused us to increase the attendance to 52 seniors and arranging for a motor coach.
- Four Winds Casino, New Buffalo, Michigan. 2 coaches transported 83 seniors to one of the newest casinos in the Midwest. Thanks to Streamwood Park District for allowing our seniors to park in the Hoosier Grove Lot.

Social Services

- Our Social Services Specialist and Liaison attended the SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) Conference located in Lisle.
- Funding for the 2011 Winter LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance) Program became available on September 1st for the senior and disabled population. Staff filed 118 applications.
- The Community Paint-a-Thon Program took place in the Townships of Hanover, Wheeling, Barrington, Schaumburg, New Trier, Niles, Northfield, and Palatine. 25 homes were painted.
- Social Services Specialist partnered with Welfare Services staff in their LIHEAP outreach to Crestwood Apartments in Elgin. They assisted 9 individuals in filing for LIHEAP.
- C-HOPE Psychiatrist conducted an informal seminar called, “Scared Sick” to 11 seniors. The program focused on reducing anxiety through alternative methods as well as medication.

Transportation

- The T.R.I.P. program has 267 residents registered. 12 one way rides were requested.
- Donations for 18 bus cards at \$15.00 each were received.
- Full time driver Juanita Espinosa started on 09/27/10. Juanita is an experienced driver and trainer from Laidlaw/First Student and has previous experience driving for Pace.
- The first new bus arrived on Monday, October 11. Dial-A-Bus participated in Touch-A- Truck on Saturday, October 2nd at Cabala's.

**WELFARE SERVICES
BOARD REPORT
OCTOBER, 2010**

I wanted to take this opportunity to thank all who attended the Candlelight Bowl. It was a night of fun and a record year for donations. Collector Liquori took home the best bowler trophy and Chief Deputy Assessor and her husband Bob took home the highest scoring couple trophy.

Sponsor-A-Family registration kicked off October 4th and the demand has been great. Sponsorships are slow coming however, we continue to reach out to our partners in the community with the hope they will be able to continue to help our needy families this holiday season.

Holiday meal boxes have been ordered and tentatively scheduled for distribution November 23rd and December 21st in the administration building parking lot. Downey Hall has been reserved for residents to keep warm while waiting.

September went very well with the new general assistance program. Invoices came in from KMART and Valero and there were no overages and no inappropriate items purchased. Recipients have commented that they are so grateful to be able to get some clothing items, winter wear and small home appliances they have been without. The gasoline vouchers have also helped recipients with the travel for doing job searches.

The economy has definitely contributed to the increase number of calls and walk-ins. Applicants are required to submit paperwork and once all is received a decision is made on a case by case basis. This process can take up to 30 days before a client is notified of the decision.

I am pleased to announce that I have been invited to represent Supervisor McGuire on CEDA's Board. The late Honorable Mel Runzel served on this board before and I am proud to follow in her footsteps.

Chase Bank has informed me they would be able to develop and implement a debit card system for general assistance recipients however, for it to be cost effective would need an estimated 500 clients. I have contacted Rich Township to see if this is something they are interested in and awaiting a response.

To continue efforts in reaching the Elgin section of the township, Welfare Services and Senior Services will be hosting another community outreach on November 15th at Crestwood Apartments to process LIHEAP and circuit breaker applications. Due to the success of the first event held in September, this will be an ongoing program available to the residents of Elgin.

CEDA's employment and housing counselors have been booked solid since they began coming in August. CEDA has suggested once the renovations are complete to maintain a

CEDA office at the Astor Avenue Community Center. This would be a great benefit to our residents of our community.

This past month:

- Human Social Services Steering Committee and Council met on September 26th and are moving toward the development of this valuable council.
- Sponsor-A-Family applications began being distributed and sponsorship will be income based.
- Senior Service provided Circuit Breaker Training to Welfare Services staff. Jennifer Busche did an outstanding job putting together and implementing the training program.
- LIHEAP and Circuit Breaker Applications continue to be filed daily.
- Welfare Services attended a luncheon at the Children's Home Aid Society in Schaumburg. Another meeting will be scheduled to discuss how to better work together.
- The Department of Community Health gave vaccines at Astor Avenue. The need for them to continue to see residents at Astor is very apparent and the numbers of residents grows monthly.
- Transitioning to a new nurse has gone well and residents have continued to be seen. The Office of Community Health was able to provide continuous service to residents although they had lost a staff person.
- Approval for the after school nutritional snack program is still pending awaiting approval from the Health Department.
- Participated in Just For The Health Of It.
- Supervisor McGuire and all of Welfare Services staff participated in Peanut Day for the Kiwanis raising money for the food pantry.

Looking forward:

- Gymkhana will be hosting a toy drive on Saturday, December 4th to benefit our residents.
- Emergency Assistance audit is scheduled for October, 2010.
- Auxiliary Staff appreciation is scheduled for November 3rd.
- Veteran Honor Roll dinner is scheduled for November 4th.
- Community Center Halloween Pizza Party on October 29th beginning at 2:30pm.
- Thanksgiving Meal Box Giveaway on November 23rd at the Administration Parking Lot.
- Winter Wear Drive begins November 1st. Fashion Bug has donated racks to hang the coats on.

October 19, 2010

1. The New Leaders in Education Reception will be held on Tuesday, October 19th, 2010, 5:00PM – 7:00PM in Veteran’s Hall. The following Principals will be honored: Jeff Smith, Canton Middle School, Karen Mink, Bartlett Elementary School, Dr. Christine Dennison, Independence Center for Early Learning, Harold Shepherd, Hanover Countryside Elementary School, and Susan Smith, Nature Ridge Elementary School.
2. Jared Robl, MSW, has accepted a full time family therapist position. Jared obtained his MSW from Loyola University, Chicago. Jared has experience in both community and clinical practice. Jared is also experienced working with special needs children. Continued search is taking place to fill a second full time family therapist position.
3. The Tutoring Program started the fall semester on Thursday, October, 14th, 2010. Currently there are 50 students registered. Successful orientations have occurred at the Streamwood High School Sabre Center. A secondary education math teacher has been hired to tutor high school students. Continued search is occurring to secure a secondary education science tutor. Thank you to the Board for allowing the students and tutors in the Tutoring Program to use their lap top computers for skill development and access to web resources.
4. The Open Gym Program started on September 27th, 2010. Outreach to schools and surrounding neighborhoods is occurring to increase participation and to generate more cross over participation between sites. Planning has begun to develop clinical programming at Open Gym sites.
5. The Fall Open Gym Fundraising Rummage Sale is going to take place on Saturday, October, 23rd, 2010, from 9:00AM – 3:00PM in Veteran’s Hall. Donations are currently being accepted to be sold at the Sale, with all proceeds going to the Hanover Township Foundation to be used for the Open Gym Program. If you have items to be donated, or know of people who would like to donate items, please contact Michael Cohen, MA, Outreach and Prevention Services Manager at (630) 483-5799. The Senior Center Gift Shop will be open for business during the Sale with hopes of generating new customers and further community awareness of Senior Services. All winter wear clothing that does not sell will be donated to Hanover Townships Welfare Services. All remaining items not sold at the Sale will be donated to the Salvation Army. Hanover Townships Committee on Youths members are donating their time prior to the Sale to organize and price donations, as well as, assisting on the day of the Sale.
6. Youth and Family Services held its annual all staff retreat on Wednesday, October, 6th, 2010. The retreat was held at the Bartlett Nature Center. The focus of the retreat was on team development and FY 12 department goal development.
7. Student focus groups have been completed as well as the surveys of the teaching staff at Streamwood High School. Finding from these efforts will be organized and analyzed by November. These findings will be utilized in developing evidence based Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions at Streamwood High School.
