	<u>Client and Family Support Services</u> : Offers case management and referral services, home based services and/or support within their family homes or individual apartments.	\$5,200
Bartlett Learning Center	<u>Clare Woods Academy Counseling Program</u> : Behavioral and Social Services program that enhances student's coping and conversational skills, anger management and increased participation in the school setting.	\$7,200
Boys and Girls Club of Elgin	<u>SMART Moves</u> : Program educates children 6-18 years regarding strategies for avoiding and resisting alcohol, tobacco and other drugs as well as decision making and critical thinking skills.	\$5,500
The Bridge Youth and Family Services	<u>Crisis Prevention/Intervention Program</u> : Provides immediate crisis intervention, short term counseling for youth and family, case management, referrals and temporary overnight placement at emergency shelters in the community.	\$10,500
Catholic Charities	<u>Northwest Senior Services Caregiver Support Programs</u> : Support groups and educational programming for family members caring for an older adult.	\$3,500
Centro de Informacion	<u>Family Centered Mental Health Services</u> : Offers referrals and case management services to the Spanish speaking population.	\$32,800
Children's Advocacy Center of North and Northwest Cook County	<u>Coordination, Advocacy, and Sensitive Interviewing Program (CASI)</u> : Crisis intervention, assessment, court advocacy and on-going supportive services for child victims (ages 3-17 years) of sexual abuse, severe physical abuse or other violent crimes.	\$18,500
	<u>Family Support Services Program (FSS)</u> : Supports specialized trauma focused counseling and follow-up services for child survivors of sexual and/or physical abuse and their non-offending family members.	\$3,300

	<u>Safe from the Start Program</u> : Therapeutic intervention and community education services provided for children and their families, serving children ages 0-5 years and their families, who have been exposed to violence.	\$18,000
Clearbrook	<u>Children's Services</u> : Early intervention for young children with developmental delays and support services for their families.	\$7,500
	<u>Day Services</u> : Offers an array of day services based on abilities, interests and life transitions and to improve daily living, communication and socialization skills.	\$4,200
	<u>Residential Services</u> : Supports a male, 6 bed Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA) housing.	\$5,000
Community Crisis Center	<u>Domestic Violence Shelter</u> : Temporary shelter provided for women and their children whom have experience domestic violence in their lives.	\$30,000
	<u>Domestic Violence Counseling</u> : Provides counseling for adult men, women and their children who have experience domestic violence.	\$26,000
	<u>Sexual Assault Counseling and Advocacy</u> : Individual, group and family counseling; legal and hospital advocacy for survivors of sexual assault and their significant others.	\$9,000
	<u>Strategies for Safety</u> : Sexual assault education program for children and adolescents offered within elementary, middle and high schools.	\$6,000
Countryside Association	<u>In-Home Respite Services</u> : Respite services for parents and caregivers of people with disabilities.	\$3,000
DayOne Network	<u>Community Access</u> : Provides support and referral services to developmentally disabled and/or delayed children and adults leaving the special education system, seeking residential placement or individuals with special needs that are not being met by their current service provider.	\$7,500
Easter Seals of DuPage and Fox Valley	<u>Outpatient Medical Rehabilitation</u> : Pediatric outpatient rehabilitation therapy for infants and children with developmental disabilities and provides other early intervention services.	\$55,000
	<u>Family Support Services</u> : Provides support services that foster the mental and social health of children with developmental disabilities and their families.	\$10,000
Ecker Center for Mental Health	<u>Therapy Services</u> : Outpatient counseling, psychiatry, nursing, case management and psychosocial rehabilitation services to those with a mental illness.	\$81,000
	<u>Psychiatric Emergency Program (PEP)</u> : 24 hour, on call psychiatric assistance program offered at Sherman Hospital. Assists with hospitalization when needed.	\$8,100
Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Chicago	<u>West Suburban Outreach Program</u> : Provides support, education, advocacy and programming to those with a diagnosis of epilepsy.	\$1,000

Family Service Association of Greater Elgin	<u>Adult Mental Health Services</u> : provides crisis intervention, assessments, mental health treatment planning, family counseling, individual counseling, community support services, case management, medication monitoring and psychiatric evaluation and treatment services to those 19 years and older.	\$12,000
	<u>Youth Mental Health Services</u> : provides crisis intervention, assessments, mental health treatment planning, family counseling, individual counseling, community support services, case management, medication monitoring and psychiatric evaluation and treatment services to those 18 years and younger.	\$22,000
Hanover Township Senior Services	<u>Senior Mental Health Services (C-Hope)</u> : Individual therapy and psychiatric evaluation and treatment for Hanover Township residents 55 years and older.	\$40,000
Hanover Township Youth and Family Services	<u>Clinical Interventionist</u> : Provides substance abuse prevention services to youth in Hanover Township.	\$50,000
	<u>Alternative to Suspension Program</u> : Services to increase students' participation level of school connectivity, lower incidence of discipline referrals and suspensions and to identify and treat any mental health issues.	\$25,000
	<u>Psychiatric Backup</u> : Offers psychiatric evaluation and treatment referral source.	\$9,000
JOURNEYS: From PADS to Hope	<u>Hope Center Program</u> : Provides assessment, counseling and referrals to individuals at the Hope Center with mental health or substance abuse issues and who are homeless or facing homelessness.	\$4,000
Kenneth Young Center	<u>Post Screening, Assessment, and Support Services (SASS)</u> : Offers post-crisis services to stabilize and re-integrate youth after a psychiatric emergency.	\$9,500
Leyden Family Services	<u>The SHARE Program</u> : Offers rehabilitation and detoxification services for males and females with a substance abuse problem. Detox program is 3-7 day, inpatient stay. Rehabilitation is a 28 day, inpatient stay.	\$50,000
Maryville Academy	<u>Casa Salama Program</u> : Provide music therapy to young women with mental health issues that live in residential programs on Maryville's Bartlett campus.	\$25,000
Northwest Center Against Sexual Assault	<u>Sexual Assault Intervention Services</u> : Specialized counseling for sexual assault survivors of all ages, 24/7 crisis intervention hotline services, 24/7 in-person medical advocacy at 7 hospitals and 24/7 criminal justice advocacy services.	\$8,200
Northwest Compass	<u>Legacy Corps</u> : In home respite care, child care respite, transportation services, traditional caregiver services for veterans and their families and/or caregivers.	\$20,000
Open Door Clinic	<u>HIV/AIDS Mental Health Outreach</u> : Educational programming to those at risk for HIV due to mental health and substance abuse issues.	\$5,000

PADS of Elgin	<u>Emergency Shelter Program</u> : Provides shelter to men, women and children in crisis. Services also include case management, money management education and referral services to area agencies.	\$25,000
Renz Addiction Counseling Center	<u>Outpatient Services</u> : Provides substance abuse and compulsive gambling treatment. Clinical services include individual, group, couples and/or family counseling, in addition to intervention services.	\$60,000
Shelter, Inc.	<u>Healthy Families Program</u> : Provides new mothers with training and education needed to protect their babies from abuse by offering case management and advocacy services to those mothers interested in the program.	\$12,500
Summit School	<u>Early Learning Center</u> : Enrolls children with identified delays into an at-risk pre-kindergarten program that offer intensive services to help children overcome the challenges of their delays.	\$12,000
WINGS	<u>Domestic Violence/Homeless Shelter for Women</u> : Provides housing to women and children that are homeless due to domestic violence and other causes through an array of housing that includes emergency shelter, transitional housing and permanent supportive housing. Also provides counseling to women who are not ready to leave their abuser	\$10,000
