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**Hanover Township Tutoring program to begin for fall semester**

As youth advance in school, homework assignments get tougher; especially in math and reading. Hanover Township's Tutoring Program aims at guiding students to become successful independent learners. The Township's small tutoring groups encourage children to ask questions and teach them how to best learn at their own pace. Certified tutors use today's teaching methods and specialize in assisting students with academic comprehension, mastery of skills, and homework completion. Tutoring groups are developed based on age, subject matter, and learning needs that are identified by referring teachers. Children who attend regularly and bring their school materials/assignments to each session improve in academic performance and become more self-confident.
