LETTER FROM THE SUPERVISOR



Greetings,

Thank you for taking the time to familiarize yourself with the Hanover Township Department of Aging Services in the 2019-2020 annual report. The department, through its life enrichment, social services, transportation and nutrition divisions, offers comprehensive services and solutions for every segment of the older adult population to live a healthy, active and independent lifestyle.

The community understands the need and importance of this service. In 2002, the residents passed a referendum creating a tax levy to ensure the Township had the infrastructure and resources to offer comprehensive services. The Senior Center experienced over 38,000 visits last year alone. This facility remains the only Township-operated center to be accredited by the National Institute of Senior Centers and only of three in the State of Illinois.

As you turn the pages of this report, I encourage you to look closely to understand the impact these metrics and financial numbers have on improving the quality of life for our older adult population. Each program and service is carefully reviewed annually to ensure its efficiency and relevancy to meeting our mission.

You will also notice a change in leadership in the department. Former Director Tracey Colagrossi accepted a position last May with the Village of Arlington Heights to manage their Senior Center. Tracey contributed greatly to the department and Township's successes through her 15 years with the organization.

The Township Board approved the appointment of Megan Conway in July as the new Director of Aging Services. Before joining Schaumburg Township in 2017 as the Director of Senior and Disability Services, Megan served as the Social Services Manager in the Aging Services department for six years.


